Both textbooks unite vocal pedagogy and choral conducting with voice science and are published by Plural Publishing. Dr. Smith is the author of *Can*-



Considered "a mezzo in a class by herself" (New York Times), **Dolora Zajick** has been internationally acclaimed as that rare voice type, a true dramatic mezzo-soprano. 
