### Keynote Speaker: Tecumseh W.Fitch

Tecumseh Fitch is Professor of Cognitive Biology, in the Department of Cognitive Biology, University of Vienna. His main interests are in vertebrate bioacoustics, and in the evolution of cognition, particularly the evolution of human speech, language, and music. He studies these topics from a broad comparative perspective that combines empirical research on humans and animals, including chimpanzees, seals, deer, dogs, alligators and parrots. His recent book (Fitch 2010 book The Evolution of Language, Cambridge University Press) reviews this approach as applied to human language. Fitch's undergraduate training was in Biology and Medicine (1986), and he received his PhD in Cognitive and Linguistic Sciences (1994), both at Brown University. After post-doctoral training in the Speech & Hearing Sciences Program in Boston (Harvard/

MIT), he occupied a Lectureship at Harvard University, first teaching Biology and then Psychology. In 2004 he moved to the University of St Andrews, in Scotland, where he was Reader in the School of Psychology. In 2009 he moved to his current position in the School of Life Sciences in Vienna, where he co-founded the Department of Cognitive Biology. He was a fellow at the European Institute for Advanced Studies (2002, Berlin) and the Max Planck Institute for Evolutionary Anthropology (2005, Leipzig), and occupied the 2005-2006 Leibniz Professorship at the Univer-

### Master Class with VERA Award Winner: Diana Soviero

Diana Soviero is one of the most recognized American opera singers of the twentieth century. As her lyric soprano voice blossomed into a spinto with vivid colors, Ms. Soviero became a compelling interpreter of the Verismo repertoire. She created a gallery of unforgettable operatic portraits in performances at leading international opera houses including Metropolitan Opera, Teatro alla Scala, Teatro dell'Opera di Roma, Royal Opera Covent Garden, Vienna Staatsoper, Théâtre national de l'Opéra de Paris, Opéra de Paris Bastille, Hamburg Staatsoper, Bayerische Staatsoper in Munich, Chicago Lyric Opera, Houston Grand Opera, and San Francisco Opera. Ms. Soviero recorded the definitive album Verismo, on Analekta Recordings, with l'Orchestre de l'Opéra de Montréal, conducted by Joseph Rescigno. It includes standard Verismo arias such as Madama Butterfly and Cavalleria rusticana to lesser known works including Leoncavallo's Zaza and Cilea's Adriana Lecouvreur. She was also a part of the compilation Telarc recordings Divine Sopranos and Classics of the Silver Screen, performing various

signature repertoire including "Un bel di vedremo" from Madama Butterfly, "O mio babbino caro" from Gianni Schicchi, and "Ebben?...Ne andrò lontana" from La Wally, with Erich Kunzel conducting. In addition, Ms. Soviero performed Madame Raquin in the world premiere of Tobias Picker's Thérèse Raquin, which was recorded live with the Dallas Opera, and released on the Chandos label.

Ms. Soviero has dedicated herself to teaching young singers with the same passion that characterized her singing and acting career. She is currently one of the Metropolitan

Opera's official voice teachers and acting coaches of the Lindemann Young Artist Development Program, giving both private lessons as well as private/public Masterclasses.

### VERA Award Winner: Barry Bittman, MD

Barry Bittman, MD is a neurologist, author, international speaker, award-winning producer/director and inventor. As CEO and Medical Director of the Mind-Body Wellness Center, a comprehensive, interdisciplinary outpatient medical facility in Meadville, PA., Dr. Bittman has pioneered a new paradigm for treating the "whole person." His interdisciplinary strategy integrates the power of mind, body and spirit with conventional medical care. Dr. Bittman has developed similar pro-



grams for individuals facing the challenges of asthma, cardiovascular disease, chronic lung disease, diabetes and hypertension. He has written several medical

articles on topics ranging from clinical neuropharmacology and pain management to music, laughter, and spirituality. His medical perspectives, emphasizing a mind-body approach, have been presented in his book, *Reprogramming Pain*, written for transforming pain and suffering into health and success. His book, *Maze of Life*, co-authored with Anthony DeFail, is a soul-searching parable about restoring hope, meaning and purpose amidst life's challenges.

Dr. Bittman's latest research demonstrated for the first time that playing a musical instrument reverses multiple elements of the human stress response on the genomic level (Medical Science Monitor Feb. 2005). Dr. Bittman subsequently introduced and coined the term, individualized genomic stress induction signatures, which uniquely describes biological diversity in action.

Dr. Bittman is the CEO and President of the Yamaha Music & Wellness Institute.

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
